Proverbs 3:7 Do not be wise in your own eyes; fear the LORD and shun evil.

Proverbs 3:34 He mocks proud mockers but gives grace to the humble.

Proverbs 6: 16 There are six things the LORD hates, seven that are detestable to him:

17 haughty eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood...

Proverbs 8:13 To fear the LORD is to hate evil; I hate pride and arrogance, evil behavior and perverse speech.

Proverbs 9:7 Whoever corrects a mocker invites insult; whoever rebukes a wicked man incurs abuse. 8 Do not rebuke a mocker or he will hate you; rebuke a wise man and he will love you. 9 Instruct a wise man and he will be wiser still; teach a righteous man and he will add to his learning.

Proverbs 10:17 He who heeds discipline shows the way to life, but whoever ignores correction leads others astray.

Proverbs 10:19 When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise.

Proverbs 11:2 When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom.

Proverbs 12: 1 Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but he who hates correction is stupid.

Proverbs 12:9 Better to be a nobody and yet have a servant than pretend to be somebody and have no food.

Proverbs 12:15 The way of a fool seems right to him, but a wise man listens to advice.

Proverbs 13: 1 A wise son heeds his father's instruction, but a mocker does not listen to rebuke.

Proverbs 13:7 One man pretends to be rich, yet has nothing; another pretends to be poor, yet has great wealth.

Proverbs 13:10 Pride only breeds quarrels, but wisdom is found in those who take advice.

Proverbs 13:13 He who scorns instruction will pay for it, but he who respects a command is rewarded.

Proverbs 14:6 The mocker seeks wisdom and finds none, but knowledge comes easily to the discerning.

Proverbs 15: 1 A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

Proverbs 15:12 A mocker resents correction; he will not consult the wise.

Proverbs 15:22 Plans fail for lack of counsel, but with many advisers they succeed.

Proverbs 15:25 The LORD tears down the proud man's house but he keeps the widow's boundaries intact.

Proverbs 15: 31 He who listens to a life-giving rebuke will be at home among the wise. 32 He who ignores discipline despises himself, but whoever heeds correction gains understanding. 33 The fear of the LORD teaches a man wisdom, and humility comes before honor.

Proverbs 16:5 The LORD detests all the proud of heart. Be sure of this: They will not go unpunished.

Proverbs 16: 18 Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall. 19 Better to be lowly in spirit and among the oppressed than to share plunder with the proud. Proverbs 16:25 There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death.

Proverbs 17:5 He who mocks the poor shows contempt for their Maker; whoever gloats over disaster will not go unpunished.

Proverbs 17:7 Arrogant lips are unsuited to a fool— how much worse lying lips to a ruler!

Proverbs 17:19 He who loves a quarrel loves sin; he who builds a high gate invites destruction.

Proverbs 18:2 A fool finds no pleasure in understanding but delights in airing his own opinions

Proverbs 18:12 Before his downfall a man's heart is proud, but humility comes before

Proverbs 20:3 It is to a man's honor to avoid strife, but every fool is quick to quarrel.

Proverbs 21:4 Haughty eyes and a proud heart, the lamp of the wicked, are sin!

Proverbs 21:24 The proud and arrogant man—"Mocker" is his name; he behaves with overweening pride.

Proverbs 22:4 Humility and the fear of the LORD bring wealth and honor and life.

Proverbs 22:10 Drive out the mocker, and out goes strife; quarrels and insults are ended.

Proverbs 25:6 Do not exalt yourself in the king's presence, and do not claim a place among great men; 7 it is better for him to say to you, "Come up here," than for him to humiliate you before a nobleman.

Proverbs 25:27 It is not good to eat too much honey, nor is it honorable to seek one's own honor.

Proverbs 26:12 Do you see a man wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him

Proverbs 27:1 Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth. 2 Let another praise you, and not your own mouth; someone else, and not your own lips.

Proverbs 27:21 The crucible for silver and the furnace for gold, but man is tested by the praise he receives.

Proverbs 28:26 He who trusts in himself is a fool, but he who walks in wisdom is kept safe.

Proverbs 29: 1 A man who remains stiff-necked after many rebukes will suddenly be destroyed—without remedy.

Proverbs 29:8 Mockers stir up a city, but wise men turn away anger.

Proverbs 29:23 A man's pride brings him low, but a man of lowly spirit gains honor.

Proverbs 30:13 those whose eyes are ever so haughty, whose glances are so disdainful:
