Three reasons Jesus was the perfect sacrifice: I. Jesus' sacrifice us for heaven. A. The tabernacles needed to be . . Hebrews 9:23 (NIV84) It was necessary, then, for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these sacrifices, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. John 1:29 (NIV) The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of **God**, who takes away the sin of the world! B. It was that Jesus died! Hebrews 9:24 (NIV84) For Christ did not enter a man-made sanctuary that was only a copy of the true one; he entered heaven itself, now to appear for us in God's presence. 1. WE are the 'tabernacle'/temple where God now dwells! 2 Corinthians 6:16b (NIV) For we are the temple of the living God. Ephesians 2:22 (NIV) And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit. Ephesians 1:13-14 (NIV84) Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, 14 who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance until the redemption of those who are God's possession—to the praise of his glory. II. Jesus' sacrifice ______ forgiveness for our sins. A. One sacrifice, that's . Hebrews 9:25-26 (NIV84) Nor did he enter heaven to offer himself again and again, the way the high priest enters the Most Holy Place every year with that is not his own.

²⁶ Then Christ would have had to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But now he has appeared once for all at the end of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself.

- 1. Don't get confused by 1 John 1:9.
 - 1 John 1:9 (NIV) If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
- 2. All means all and that's all all means.
 - 1 John 1:7 (NIV84) But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.
 - Romans 6:10 (NIV84) The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God.

- 4. Discuss your understanding of what happens to unbelievers at the point of death. Contrast that to what happens to believers. Use Scripture to make your points.
- 5. Tell your story, describing how you received forgiveness through Jesus' sacrifice.
