Discussion Questions:

- In what ways can we cultivate a fear of God that outweighs our concern for the opinions of others, as demonstrated by Paul's confrontation with Peter in Galatians 2:11-12?
- Paul confronted Peter out of love and concern for the truth of the Gospel.
 How can we practically invite correction in our own lives, and what obstacles might we face when receiving it?
- 3. Reflecting on Galatians 2:13, what are some modern-day examples of how a leader's hypocrisy might influence their followers? How can we proactively model sincerity in our own leadership roles?
- 4. Proverbs 15:31 teaches that life-giving correction leads to wisdom. How can we distinguish between constructive reproof and criticism that may not be helpful? Can you share a personal experience where reproof led to a positive change?
- 5. Consider Paul's courage to confront Peter. What steps can we take to approach similar situations in our own lives where we may need to correct a friend or colleague? What fears might we need to overcome?
- 6. The discussion of one unifying Gospel is central to the early Church. Briefly share your story of how you became a true Believer in Christ.
